A terrific storm occurred at IMM last Autumn. That storm was production. The photos on the opposite side reflect the days we strive for: locations all set, sunny days, talent who know their lines, all equipment behaving as we battle toward getting the shots to tell God's stories on video screens.

What we don't have photos of are the sweat, tears, and sometimes the blood. (I still have a thorn embedded somewhere below a finger joint. Can't see it, but I can feel it!) Here are some examples!

One sunny day our production convoy prayed and pulled out of the IMM parking lot for a five hour drive down the highway to the Terra Mitica location. Halfway through our passenger van had a blowout. The cargo van I was driving was filled to the top with a couple tons of props, sets and tools. But it was the passenger van, carrying valued team members that blew. No one was hurt! The van was towed and repaired. An hour later, that same van had a second blowout. Again, no one was hurt. But our team witnessed to a woman who came in the rescue vehicle.

Another day, in a Roman house in Valladolid an actor was loudly proclaiming a line in the script about God's ability to heal. Suddenly, one of our team ran off set and started vomiting quite loudly outside the door. In 24 hours, that stomach bug took out half our team, many powered through. Denise caught it the moment she rested three days later at home.

In the Tabernas we needed to drive down a long, dry riverbed into the desert. The previous day the area was experiencing flash flood warnings. When we arrived, the rains had stopped and the high winds had dried up the moisture enough that we were able to get everything in with no problem.

You see, you are helping us reclaim hearts in dark regions where these productions will proclaim the Gospel! The second week of February two of our Women of the Bible series began broadcast in Arabic over satellite from Al-Hayat TV. This satellite blankets the Middle East with its signal and the US!
